Resolution #17

Motion made by Trustee Roberts, Seconded by Trustee Woods, RESOLVED, as WHEREAS, a section of State Route 28 passes through the Village of Newport and is under the authority of the New York State Department of Transportation (DOT), and

WHEREAS, this section of the roadway is faced by the Masonic Temple, the Village Library, the Fire Department, and a commercial property known as Maw's Farm, with retail sales of produce and farm products, all of which generate substantial local traffic, and

WHEREAS, this section of highway is posted for a 45 mile per hour speed limit for a distance of several hundred yards within the Village limits and it is the belief of the Newport Village Board that allowing traffic to follow the 45 mile per hour limit within the Village limits encourages drivers to exceed the Village speed limit after they pass through the 45 mile per hour zone, but still within the village limits, NOW, be it resolved, that the Newport Village Board formally requests that the New York State Department of Transportation modify the speed limit from 45 to 30 miles per hour on the southern section Route 28 in the village from the Village Library to the sign marking the southern village boundary line.
