Dick Foster wanted to know if a lower % would lower customer bills.

Audrey said the villages are free to talk to other providers, used to be exclusive to just TWC. If they wanted to break agreement they used to have to give significant notice and now they do not.

Dick Foster wanted to know if it would be worth an audit if amount isn't going to be worth the return. Thinking that an audit would cost somewhere between \$8,000.00 to \$12,000.00. For an audit they would only look back for 6 years.

Trustee Farrell wanted to know if they weren't exclusive why we would change from 15 to 10 years.

Audrey said that it would have to do with all new technology coming up and changing all the time.

Mayor Hennings said that she would post of village website for review and will continue to see if the Term can be changed.

Dick Foster said if there was free cable for municipal building (fire house, Library or playground) Audrey said she didn't see where that was offered anywhere.

Chris Wood is in favor of audit she thinks that it is being part of a respectful municipality. If nothing found there would be nothing paid out for this service.
